#### Study

Halton Region has completed a Class Environmental Assessment (EA) Study to address future travel demands on Ninth Line (Regional Road 13) from Dundas Street (Regional Road 5) to Upper Middle Road (Regional Road 38) in the Town of Oakville. The study has been conducted in compliance with Schedule C of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (October 2000, amended 2007), which is approved under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act.

Taking into consideration the comments that were received from the Town of Oakville, regulatory agencies and the public, Halton Region is recommending reconstructing and widening Ninth Line with the following features:

- · A basic right-of-way width of 38m (varies);
- · 4-lane urban roadway comprised of 2 through lanes per direction;
- On-road bike lanes and a 3.0 m multi-use pathway on the west side with 1.5 m sidewalk on the east side of the roadway

#### The Process

The Environmental Study Report (ESR) has been prepared to document the planning, public consultation and decision making process undertaken for this study. By this Notice, the ESR is being placed on the public record for a 30-day review period in accordance with the requirements of the Municipal Class EA. Subject to comments received as a result of this Notice and the receipt of necessary approvals, Halton Region intends to proceed with the detail design and construction of Ninth Line as documented in the ESR.
